

The story we encountered was difficult. A student named Yanza raised her hand and shared how an older man had solicited her friends for sex in exchange for the monthly supplies they needed for their periods. We heard this while presenting training in the Mathare school in Nairobi with Yvonne, a leader of Thrive (the Set Free Movement team in Kenya).

Yvonne explained more to our team after we left the school.

The girls see their parents struggling. Most have lost a job in the past couple of years and are living hand to mouth. The students see the dire situation for the family and want to help. As awful as it sounds, it can be tempting to try to obtain pads when men approach them this way so they can stay in school and

help their families. Even if it's a month when the parents can afford supplies, there is so much anxiety about what the future holds. What will next month be like?

Yvonne continued, "I love this partnership between Wunders, ICCM, the Set Free Movement and Thrive. Wunders kits are the tool to take care of this problem. I always feel so great when we present the training and kits. I picture myself in their shoes and see them having a future now."

Yanza's story and stories like hers can be difficult to understand, especially when menstrual health supplies are such an obvious need. Despite the realities girls go through due to period poverty, there is hope.

A Wunders kit will last at least two to three years. For 24-36 months, a girl doesn't have to worry about finding menstrual health supplies or how her family will afford them.

Over the last few months, we received feedback and thank you notes from some of the girls in ICCM schools who have received kits. We are encouraged to know the kits are making a tangible difference in their lives. Each time we distribute kits, we have the distinct privilege of letting young women know they are made in the Image of God and are valued and beloved. Our curriculum also includes culturally specific human-trafficking prevention training. What an honor for us to come alongside these young women in Kenya!

I've been listening to *The Journal of John Wesley*. He was chased down, stoned, rejected and condemned. Yet he proclaimed the gospel to all he could. In Acts, we find the disciples were jailed, shipwrecked, and some killed. But they kept going. Jesus died on the cross to bring forgiveness for our sins and heal our shame, enabling us to live abundantly.

Missionary Adoniram Judson wrote,

"There is no success without sacrifice. If you succeed without sacrifice, it is because someone has suffered before you. If you sacrifice without success, it is because someone will succeed after."

Set Free leaders in some countries have been attacked while serving. Consequently, we are careful about using some names and faces. Other Set Free leaders are delivering food and medicine into war-torn parts of Ukraine. Our leaders sacrifice in small and big ways. Sacrifice is what is required.

Christians in China, Vietnam, Pakistan and other places experience great persecution. Some are jailed and beaten. Some lose jobs. Yet they continue proclaiming salvation, hope and healing in Jesus' name.

Sacrificial living is a characteristic of our faith (Luke 9:23, Galatians 6:14). Have we lost this fundamental teaching in our churches?

A few months ago, I was with a church leader who decided to eliminate his church's online streaming. Why? He was deeply troubled by people forsaking the "gathering of the saints" (Hebrews 10:25). There is a theology of leaving comfort and gathering in the name of the Lord as a united, free people. It is countercultural and a great witness to refuse the easy way.

Jesus demands we count the cost. To follow Jesus is not just to believe but to pick up the cross and follow him into suffering and joy. In some inexplicable way, suffering and joy seem to be linked (Matthew 16:24, James 1:2).

Kuntee and Sopeep, the patriarch and matriarch of Free Methodist work in Cambodia, came out of the Khmer Rouge genocide with vibrancy, resilience and faith in Jesus. They are some of the most joyful, generous people I have ever met. They suffered greatly. They have few earthly possessions yet are earnest Christians. They follow Jesus daily into suffering and joy, and the fruit is a thriving Christian movement in Cambodia.

As an American serving globally, I wonder, what are we sacrificing for the Kingdom? I hear people moaning and groaning about the government and moral issues in America. I hear people wanting revival. Friends, there will be no revival without sacrifice, surrender and following Jesus earnestly. We need to count the cost.

By An ICCM Creative Access Country Leader

It was a hot, sunny day, and our ministry team was visiting one of the refugee camps outside a major city in a creative access country. The team had received a call informing them about Magda, a woman who was widowed when extremists attacked her peaceful village in 2014. Magda's husband was killed, but she escaped with her seven children. As a result of this trauma, Magda developed type 2 diabetes. She did not work and had no source of income to feed her children.

Informed of the family's needs, ICCM gave a generous gift toward purchasing goats for Magda to start Seven, a microenterprise. The ministry team helped Magda build a shelter for the seven goats she received, two of which soon gave birth. The ministry provided food packs for the family, goat feed and medications for one year. Now, Magda has 14 goats, several of which are pregnant. She has a flourishing small business selling baby goats and providing for her family.

Animals benefit children and families at ICCM schools and projects in several of the 33 countries served. Animals produce nutritional, educational and economic benefits to children and families in need. Perhaps you and your family or small group would consider giving the gift of an animal to a family as part of your Christmas celebration this year.

02 ► Friday | Australia

Pray for growing work in Australia as several leaders expand their ministry. Pray also for new contacts being developed in New Zealand.

03≻ Saturday | Bulgaria

Join the Bulgarian leaders in praying for ongoing opportunities to train the next generation of leaders in the Balkans.

04≻ Sunday | Nicaragua

Praise the Lord for a new well in a rural area of Nicaragua. More than 150 children and their families now have access to clean water. Pray for continued community transformation resulting from improved quality of life.

05≻ Monday | Middle East

Joanne is planning some one-day training sessions for local midwives. Pray for these training sessions, the women being trained, and the refugee women they will serve.

06 Tuesday | Tanzania

Pray the believer's love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so they may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless ... filled with the fruit of righteousness ... to the glory and praise of God (Philippians 1:9-11).
