The Tai National Park, an ancient forest, is home to the small pygmy hippopotamus.



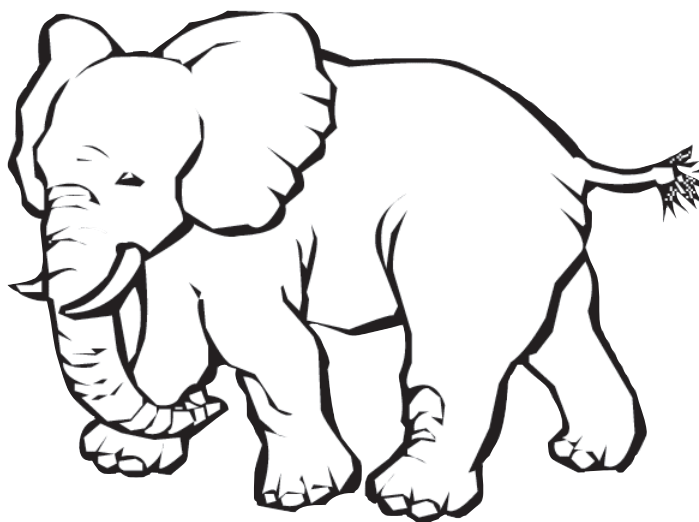
More than 70% of the nation's population depends on the success of its agriculture and tourism industries.
