



# Being Witnesses for Jesus

Multi-Ethnic Ministry Series: Video 6 - Dialogue 2

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<b>Group Facilitator:</b>	Take a moment to outline what the discussion will be, and open your time together with prayer.
<b>Scripture Reading:</b>	2 Corinthians 5:14-21
<b>Opening Exercise:</b>	<p>View Video 6 – “Engaging Our Future”</p> <p>Give participants a moment of silence after viewing the video to reflect on what phrase or idea left the greatest impression on them. Have participants write down the phrase or idea so they don’t forget!</p> <p>Ask, “What spoke to you and why?”</p>
<b>Opening Question:</b>	What are the bridges that exist between the people in our community and the peoples of the world?
<b>Scripture Focus:</b>	<p>Acts 1:6-9</p> <p>What were the disciples of Jesus focused on?</p> <p>How does Jesus’ response reveal what His priority is for us?</p> <p>What promise does Jesus give to His followers?</p> <p>Witness defined:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Attestation of a fact or event</li><li>• One that gives evidence</li><li>• One asked to be present and able to testify</li><li>• One who has personal knowledge of something</li></ul> <p>Given the above definition, what does it mean to be a witness for Jesus?</p> <p>How should our church interpret “Jerusalem”? “Judea and Samaria”? “the ends of the earth”?</p> <p>What connections exist between the people in our community and the people of the world?</p> <p>How does our church need to be a witness for Jesus in both our community and the world?</p>
<b>Personal Response:</b>	Reflect on 2 Peter 3:15-16 and your personal faith story. Take time to write it out, and be prepared to share your testimony.
<b>Group Facilitator:</b>	Have participants close their time together with prayer.

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
