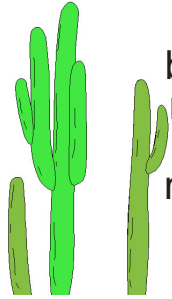


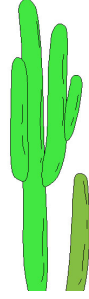

Mexico is shaped like a big horn. The country has many types of plants and trees including cactus, mesquite plants, and oak, pine, cypress and boojum trees.

Mexico (which once included the states of Texas, California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado) gained its independence from Spain in 1821.

The center emblem on Mexico's flag is an eagle standing on a cactus with a snake in its beak.



Mexico is the world's fifth largest producer of oil.

The highest point in Mexico is Orizaba, an extinct snow-capped volcano - it is 18,700 feet above sea level.
