



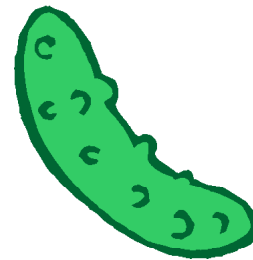

**Did you know?**

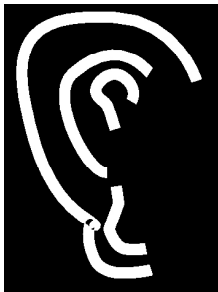


January 1 is Haiti's Independence Day.

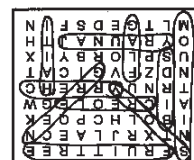
