Buenos Aires is situated as a strategic city to impact the entire region of Latin America with the love of Jesus.

The University of Buenos Aires is the best university in Latin America. In 2017, **80,000 students came from around the region** to study in the city. It is an international city, where worlds and cultures intersect.

In 1978, the Brazilian Japanese Free Methodist conference started a church for Nikkei (Japanese descendent) in Buenos Aires. Over the years and due to various issues, membership has dwindled, but the congregation has a desire to use their **strategic location** in the centralized historic

district of San Telmo to be a harbor for the world around them.

This church, through the Harbor project, will build capacity for emerging leaders from around Latin America. These student leaders will begin a movement in Buenos Aires of transformational community churches that both share the gospel and care for their communities. These students have the potential to reach not just one city but an entire region with the good news of Jesus as they return to their home countries after graduation.

This new project consisting of four strategic areas of ministry that are integrally linked to each other striving to be a Harbor.


A harbor for all nations. The Harbor Ministry Center hosts a small church started by and for Japanese speakers living in the city. The group has a desire to honor their heritage and be a multi-cultural, *international church* that reaches people regardless of national and ethnic origin.

A harbor for students. The Harbor will serve as dorm-like housing for Christian students attending the University of Buenos Aires. These students are emerging leaders from around Latin America that have a desire to connect their careers with ministry. The students will receive pastoral care and spiritual formation as well as leadership training and hands on ministry experience.

A harbor for the community.

The Harbor Ministry Center has up to 4 "store-front" type locations that will be used for *community transformation*. This could take the form of micro- enterprises and community development programs. Our first step is to get to know the community and what makes sense for the neighborhood to empower local initiatives.

A harbor for leaders. The ministry center will also serve as the location of a *Community Church Planting* training center. Leaders will be trained and mentored while simultaneously planting community churches, using the principles of Luke 10 seeking people of peace in their spheres of influence and teaching them about Jesus.
