The three biggest challenges that we have faced this year are with our family, personnel, finances.

Family: Our aging parents have come to the point where they need some extra assistance. Pray that we might have wisdom as we try to encourage, counsel, and support from afar.

Personnel: We need people to help with children's ministries, out-reach and evangelism, English ministries, web and technical development, and more! Pray for people called to serve alongside us in Budapest.

Finances: Contributions to both the Winckles Missionary Support Account (Winckles MSA) and the Hungary Church Planting and Development account (Hungary CPD) are in decline. This is due to several of our supporting churches having been closed and other churches redirecting their giving. The Hungary CPD, in particular, is experiencing a funding crisis! It was a privilege to turn over the leadership of the church to Hungarians who are called and well-prepared to serve.
