Latin America's Movement to Jinhuman Kapping Strain Strain

The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) defines human trafficking as the third-most-lucrative crime for international mafias after drug trafficking and counterfeiting of consumer goods. It is a scourge on humanity. The Free Methodist Church (FMC) in Latin America is joining forces to address this problem. In July 2023, churches across Latin America joined in a celebration of Freedom Sunday.

We realize many people throughout Latin America and around the world suffer from blind ambition, perversion and lack of pity in regard to trafficking. Our hearts grieve. We cannot remain indifferent. We are reminded that God has called us to raise our voices for those who are still oppressed today. As we read in Hebrews 13:3 (NIV), we have a responsibility to remember those in prison as if we were their fellow prisoners and those who are mistreated, as if we were the ones suffering.

In response to the invitation, 3,760 people in 124 churches from 12 countries participated in Freedom Sunday in July. A total of \$1,760 (USD) was raised in special offerings. A little more than half (56%) will go to the Kerubim Foundation, a ministry led by a Free Methodist pastor in Creative Access Country-X. The Kerubim Foundation rescues women from forced prostitution and restores their lives. The other portion of the offering (44%) will be allocated to local Set Free projects in several countries.

Adults and children are joining this great movement. The *Raíces* (FM children's curriculum) team prepared material for the children. Children could learn, experience and celebrate freedom in Christ through an illustrated Bible story, songs and activities. In each of church, children spent time in prayer, assembling a paper chain and then breaking it, symbolically interceding for the freedom Christ offers for those still held in bondage.

Through my experience working on the Empowering Transformational Churches team in Latin America, I can confidently say there are no chains that cannot be broken by God's power when we understand our calling and put every life in His hands. His Word urges us not to get tired of doing good, to continue to cry out for the captives and to be agents of His peace.

Esmeraldas is a beautiful province on the Ecuadorian Pacific Coast adorned by a brilliant sun, with waves hitting the boats that sail through its sea. But it is also an area filled with serious social conflicts affecting young people, who are easy prey to drug trafficking, crime and violence.

Jefferson Burbano lives in Esmeraldas. He is a 63-year-old man who dedicated most of his life to construction and fishing. Twenty-six years ago, Jefferson gave his life to God and has sacrificed much to serve Jesus since then. However, in 2017, something changed the course of his "boat." He participated in his first Community Church Planting (PIC is the Spanish acronym) training. During the training, he was moved to change course and become a fisher of people. Through the training, God helped Jefferson discover the necessary tools to bring the good news of the gospel to his community. He believed the gospel would turn many to repentance and transform the serious social situations Esmeraldas was experiencing.

Jefferson didn't have the profile of a potentially successful leader. He had little academic background, poor communication skills, serious financial problems, limited smartphone skills and no transportation of his own to attend meetings and training sessions. Jefferson was an ordinary believer in a working-class church in Esmeraldas. However, none of his limitations prevented his "boat" from being used by God.

Jefferson now serves in his local church, "Nuestra Roca es Cristo" (Our Rock Is Jesus), teaching and leading men. For the past five years, he has also launched Community Church Planting networks, sharing his testimony and God's story of salvation so others can know Jesus. He visits homes, runs a market as a token of God's love, and multiplies leaders through simple church-planting training.

Five churches representing 300 people have resulted from Jefferson's training and mentoring. The "houses of peace" he has planted have multiplied into other "houses of peace." Jefferson is a coach who trains others and dreams of advancing toward all God calls him to do. He prays God will raise more workers for the harvest. Today, Jefferson is participating in online ministerial training and is taking a basic computer course.

The Lord changed the course of Jefferson's "boat." The Holy Spirit does indeed empower ordinary believers to take the Word to the far corners of the earth.

A Path to Restoration and *Multiplication*

Leaders play a significant role in the construction of every society and community. In a world of constant change, the importance of trained and committed leaders cannot be underestimated. The training of national leaders emerges as a fundamental pillar for the growth of the mission district in Costa Rica. This training goes beyond mere skills and delves into the essence of leadership, embracing the comprehensive formation of healthy leaders in head, heart and hands.

In the Costa Rica Mission District, we are committed to leadership development. We provide head, heart and hands training through the online District Ministerial Training Center, with weekly meetings and an approximate attendance of 15 to 20 people in each course. For each module, we take time for holistic care, a time of accountability where students can open their hearts and be encouraged and supported by each other.

The students have also been motivated to put their learning into practice through missionary trips to various parts of the country. These trips support new Community Church Planting initiatives while training committed disciples through the Disciples Making Disciples course. One of the most recent fruits of the intentional leadership training is the "El Porvenir" Restoration Center project, an addiction rehabilitation home where lives are being transformed.

Erick was a young man drowning in a life of drug addiction and facing a terminal illness. A group of students from the Ministerial Training Center visited his home and shared the Word of God with him. In his home, Erick received Jesus into his life and found hope and motivation to move forward. Today, Erick shares his testimony with other young people and is a faithful collaborator in the "El Porvenir" project.

Investing in the comprehensive training of healthy leaders opens a pathway toward the multiplication of committed disciples who bring transformation and restoration to all communities in Costa Rica.
