Claude started out as just our taxi driver. Nothing more — at least that's what we thought. But as we rode with him through the streets of Lomé, Togo, we noticed something different. His English was excellent, his manner unfailingly kind and polite. Trip after trip, we relied on him while we were without a car, never imagining that this quiet, courteous driver would become one of the most influential people in our ministry. We had no idea God was writing a bigger story — through a taxi driver.

As he was driving us around the city each day, we learned a lot about Claude. We learned about his childhood, the churches he attended, his family and how they had all moved to Benin. Claude shared that he was in college studying English when his father passed away, and he could not continue his education.

A few weeks later, Claude suddenly stopped driving for us because his car was in the shop. His boss didn't want to pay for the costly repairs. Claude had nowhere to stay, so he slept in the car at the shop, holding on to the hope that it would be fixed so he could continue providing for himself.

Audrey and I had just found the house where we planned to stay long term, and the Lord gave us peace about an important decision. Attached to the inside of our property wall was a small room with its own bathroom,

designed to serve as the maid's quarters. We both felt clearly led to invite Claude to stay there for a few months in exchange for helping with small projects, running errands and teaching us French a couple times a week.

God provided us with a trustworthy communicator, teacher, helper and cultural guide in a world we knew very little about. And God also provided something for Claude. He began attending one of our Free Methodist churches every week and developed a growing desire to see God raise up healthy congregations that model real stewardship and genuine love for all people.

Eventually, Claude found his own apartment just a few blocks away, but he continues to help us almost daily. God placed someone in our lives who has done everything he can to help us feel welcome. His cultural insight and translation skills have been invaluable in our work.

I am deeply grateful for the relationship God provided, one where we rely on each other and grow together. I believe God has greater things ahead for Claude in the years to come.

TO PLANTING Churches

When Brother Elvis set out to sell apples on a street in Edea, he never imagined that day would change his life forever. It was November 2023 when Pastor Walters and his evangelism team met Elvis during an outreach. Someone handed Elvis a gospel tract, and Pastor Walters engaged him in a conversation about his spiritual life — a topic Elvis had long neglected and forgotten.

At that time, Elvis was struggling. The sociopolitical crisis in Cameroon's Northwest region had forced him to relocate to Edea. Elvis thought all he needed was a way to provide for himself. His only concern was survival — finding food, shelter and a way to earn a living. His life was broken, and he didn't know Jesus Christ.

His meeting with Pastor Walters gave him hope and became a turning point. Elvis accepted Christ, and his spirit came alive again. He immediately started attending church and joined membership classes within two weeks. His passion for God grew quickly, as did his desire to serve God. Soon, he became the leader of the

men's group at Edea Free Methodist Church (FMC). His commitment caught the attention of the Rev. Wilson Esambe during a visit to the Edea FMC, and after discussions with Pastor Walters, Elvis was encouraged to assume greater responsibilities.



Today, Brother Elvis has completed two pastoral courses and two church-planting programs. He now serves as assistant pastor alongside Pastor Walters at Edea FMC.

This year, the leaders of the Cameroon Free Methodist churches set a bold goal: Each local church should plant two new churches in areas without a Free Methodist presence. When Brother Parker relocated to Carrefour Bongo, Pastor Walters saw an opportunity. After speaking with Parker, they agreed to start a new work there — beginning in Brother Parker's home. Plans were made, and the Edea FMC church-planting team

visited the site. Praise God, today there is a thriving church in Carrefour Bongo, led by none other than Brother Elvis.

One Vision Turned to a *Legacy* of Faith

Dorothy Ndovie never imagined her life would change with a single vision — until the day she saw Jesus on the cross.

In that moment, everything shifted. For 10 years, Dorothy had worked as a government-employed homecraft worker trainer, teaching women how to clean, cook, sew and knit until she had the vision. On the day she had the vision, she knelt and prayed, sensing a call that would take her far beyond the skills she had taught.

An intuitive missionary urged Dorothy to attend the Bible school in Malawi, now known as Great Commission Bible School. Back in 1998, Henry and Bonnie Church were running the school, and part of the program required students to plant a church before graduation. Dorothy accepted the challenge.

From 1998 to 2002, Dorothy studied and planted her first church in Kalonga. She began with door-to-door evangelism, sharing with one household at a time. Within eight months, a congregation of about 25 people gathered. With the help of her husband and children, a church building was constructed. Out of that first congregation, a man named Kayange felt called into ministry and today serves as a Free Methodist pastor.

Dorothy didn't stop there. She started a second church in Chilumba, again going door to door. The



congregation began in her home while they molded bricks for a new building. Today, that church has grown to about 100 members — and Dorothy has faithfully served there for 25 years.

Her family has been part of this journey. One of her sons now pastors the Kalonga church. Three other sons are teachers, and her daughter works in South Africa. Through all these years, Dorothy says, lay leaders have been a great help, and her greatest joy has been her husband's encouragement: "Don't give up."

What began as a vision, turned into a calling that has impacted multiple communities and generations.
